

# C2C Large Berry Washcloth

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**Skill Level:** Easy

### **Materials**

- Crochet hook size: 4.0 mm / G
- DK (#3) weight yarn  
(I used [Knit Picks - CotLin](#))
- Total amount of yarn needed:**  
40gr/90m/98yds
- 2 stitch markers (optional)

### **Gauge (in pattern):**

Working Rows 1-15 with 4.0mm / G hook will result in a triangle with 4" (10 cm) sides.

Gauge is not crucial for this pattern.

**Finished size:** you can choose to make the pattern as a rectangle or a square, and work it as big as you'd like.  
For the amount of yarn written:  
6.5×6.5" (16.5×16.5 cm)

### **Abbreviations (US)**

- ch** - chain
- hdc** - half double crochet
- dc** - double crochet
- dc2tog** - double crochet 2 together
- L-Berry** - Large Berry: Yo, insert hook into indicated st, yo and pull up a loop. Yo and pull through **1** loop. (Yo, insert hook into same st and pull up a loop) **twice**, pull yarn through all **7** loops.
- PM** - place marker
- sc** - single crochet
- sc2tog** - single crochet 2 together
- sp** - space
- st** - stitch
- \*** - Repeats are shown via asterisks.  
Repeat begins at \* and ends at ;
- (...)** - crochet the instructions within brackets as many times as directed.
- [...]** - crochet the instructions within brackets into the same indicated st/sp.



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## Pattern Notes

- ❖ To make it easier to find the ch3 / ch2 spaces at the end of the row, place a stitch marker when you ch3/ch2 at the beginning of each row.
- ❖ When working the single crochet after the L-Berry: Work the sc tight to make the Berry pop.
- ❖ The L-Berry stitches will pop from the wrong side of your work.
- ❖ The stitch count is shown only at the beginning of the increase section to help you get the hang of the pattern.
- ❖ The washcloth can be made both as a **square** and as a **rectangle**.
- ❖ You can use this pattern to make a blanket! Just keep increasing to the desired width.

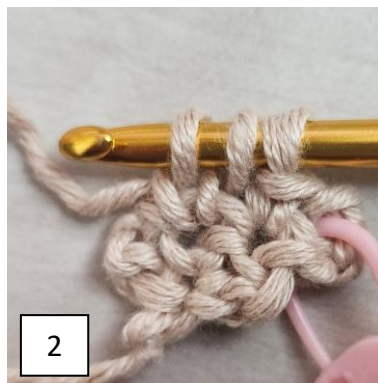

### ❖ How to crochet the Large Berry stitch (L-Berry):

Yo, insert hook into indicated st, yo and pull up a loop (*pic 1*).

Yo and pull through **1** loop (*pic 2*).

(Yo, insert hook into same st and pull up a loop only to the sc height not higher) **twice** (*pic 3&4*), pull yarn through all **7** loops (*pic 5*).



## Pattern

### Increase

Ch 4,

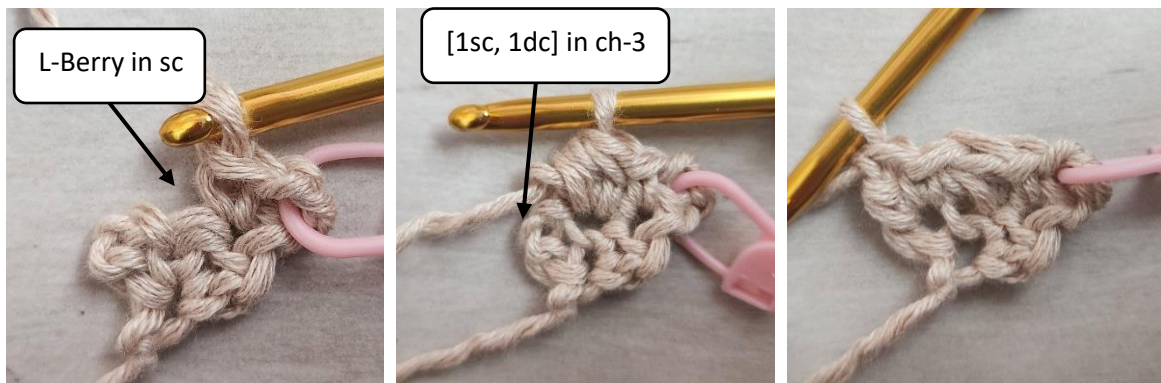
**Row 1 (RS):** [1 sc, 1 dc] in 4<sup>th</sup> chain from hook, turn.

*(1 sc, 1 dc, 1 ch-3 sp)*



**Row 2 (WS):** Ch 3-PM, 1 sc in 1<sup>st</sup> dc, 1 L-Berry in next sc, [1 sc, 1 dc] in ch-3 sp, turn.

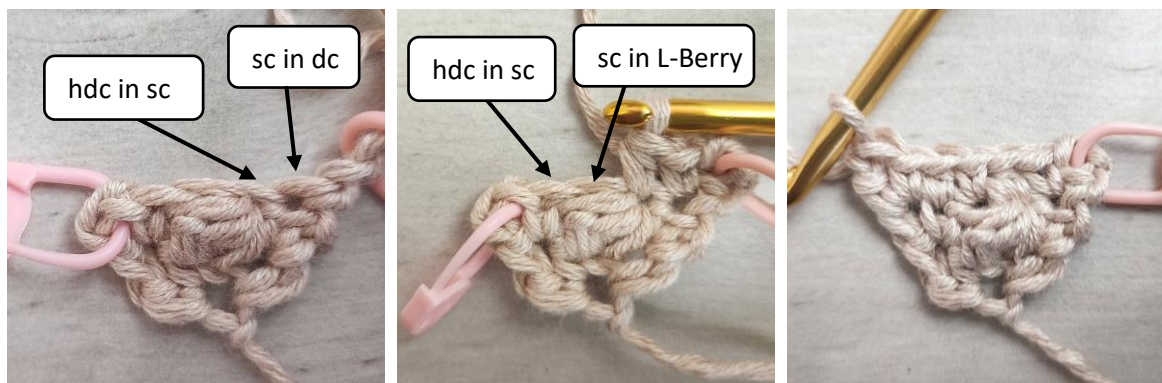
*(2 sc, 1 dc, 1 Berry, 1 ch-3 sp)*



**Row 3 (RS):** Ch 3-PM, 1 sc in 1<sup>st</sup> dc, 1 hdc in next sc.

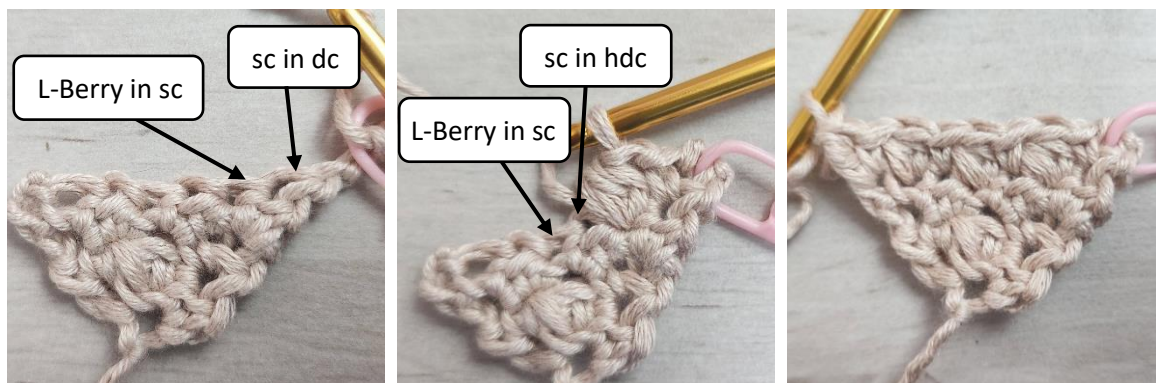
1 sc in next L-Berry, 1 hdc in next sc, [1 sc, 1 dc] in ch-3 sp, turn.

*(3 sc, 2 hdc, 1 dc, 1 ch-3 sp)*



**Row 4 (WS):** Ch 3-PM, 1 sc in 1<sup>st</sup> dc, 1 L-Berry in next sc.

\* 1 sc in next hdc, 1 L-Berry in next sc; Repeat from \* until ch-3 sp, [1 sc, 1 dc] in ch-3 sp, turn. (4 sc, 1 dc, 3 Berry, 1 ch-3 sp)



**Row 5 (RS):** Ch 3-PM, 1 sc in 1<sup>st</sup> dc, 1 hdc in next sc.

\* 1 sc in next L-Berry, 1 hdc in next sc; Repeat from \* until ch-3 sp, [1 sc, 1 dc] in ch-3 sp, turn. (5 sc, 4 hdc, 1 dc, 1 ch-3 sp)



**If you want your project to be a square**

Repeat rows 4-5 until you reach 6.5" (16.5 cm) or your desired length, make sure to **finish with row 5.**

Then skip rows 6-8 and start decreasing on both sides from row 9.

**If you want your project to be a rectangle**

Repeat rows 4-5 until you reach 6.5" (16.5 cm) or your desired length, make sure to finish with row 5.

Then start decreasing on one side - row 6.

## Decrease on one side

**Row 6 (WS):** Ch 3-PM, 1 sc in 1<sup>st</sup> dc, 1 L-Berry in next sc, 1 sc in next hdc.

\* 1 L-Berry in next sc, 1 sc in next hdc; Repeat from \* until 1 sc left before ch-3 sp, dc2tog in last sc & ch-3 sp, turn.



**Row 7 (RS):** Ch 2-PM, skip 1<sup>st</sup> dc2tog & sc.

\* 1 sc in next L-Berry, 1 hdc in next sc; Repeat from \* until ch-3 sp, [1 sc, 1 dc] in ch-3 sp, turn.



**Row 8 (WS):** Ch 3-PM, 1 sc in 1<sup>st</sup> dc.

\* 1 L-Berry in next sc, 1 sc in next hdc; Repeat from \* until 1 sc left before ch-2 sp, dc2tog in last sc & ch-2 sp, turn.

**Repeat rows 7-8 to the desired width**, finishing with **row 7**, then continue to decrease on both sides.

## Decrease on both sides

**Row 9 (WS):** Ch 2-PM, skip 1<sup>st</sup> dc & sc, 1 sc in next hdc.

\* 1 L-Berry in next sc, 1 sc in next hdc; Repeat from \* until 1 sc left before ch-2 sp, dc2tog in last sc & ch-2 sp, turn.



**Row 10 (RS):** Ch 2-PM, skip 1<sup>st</sup> dc2tog & sc, 1 sc in next L-Berry.

\* 1 hdc in next sc, 1 sc in next L-Berry; Repeat from \* until 1 sc left before ch-2 sp, sc2tog in last sc & ch-2 sp, turn.



**Row 11 (WS):** Ch 2-PM, skip 1<sup>st</sup> sc2tog & sc, 1 sc in next hdc.

\* 1 L-Berry in next sc, 1 sc in next hdc; Repeat from \* until 1 sc left before ch-2 sp, dc2tog in last sc & ch-2 sp, turn.

**Continue working rows 10-11 until you have a total of 4 sts + ch2 in your row (1 sc, 1 L-Berry, 1 sc, 1 dc2tog).**



**Row 12 (RS):** Ch2-PM, skip 1<sup>st</sup> dc2tog & sc, 1 sc in next L-Berry, sc2tog in last sc & ch-2, turn.

**Row 13 (WS):** ch1, skip 1<sup>st</sup> sc2tog & sc, 1 sc in ch-2 sp. Fasten off.

**Fasten off and weave ends. Soak and block if needed.**
